A letter from Ani-Wa'ya Chapter Secretary Joshua Rowley:

These last two months have been busy for the Ani-Wa-Ya chapter in the name of service. On November 17th the chapter held their annual "Gobbler Grab". The purpose is to raise turkeys for families who can't afford a traditional Thanksgiving meal. When the event was over a total of over 350 turkeys were raised. Then on December 8th the chapter held its annual toy drive, where members of the chapter all brought non-violent gifts to be donated. The toys will be donated to Toys-for-tots so less fortunate children will receive gifts this holiday season. Both of these donation have been going on for around 20 years now.

2016 marks Ani-Wa'ya Chapter's 20th Annual Gobbler Grab. In 20 years, the chapter has collected 11,244 turkeys weighing approximately 134,928 pounds (67.5 tons).
